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Camp Discovery Guidelines

Camp Discovery at St. Peter's School is dedicated to our school motto, "Learning to Love, Loving to Learn." Discipline, morality, spirituality and excellence in education are integral parts of a child's life. Camp Discovery meets the needs of each individual child and also fosters a loving and caring family atmosphere. In order for our camp family to be an effective unit, we have provided certain rules and guidelines.

Sick Children: Do not send sick children to camp. Your child must be free from fever for 24 hours before reporting to camp. In the event that a student becomes ill while at camp, the school will contact a parent or other person designated on the emergency card to pick up the child. We cannot keep sick children at camp because of the risk of spreading illness to others.

Medication: If your child needs to take medication, whether prescribed or over-the-counter, you must complete a medical release form in the school office. It is against camp policy for the staff to dispense any medication without written parental permission. Label all medications with your child's name and specific instructions for administering them. Keep all prescribed medications in the original container with the original label. If a child takes daily medication, please be sure there is an adequate supply at camp for emergency situations so the staff will not need to call you. Do not send medication in your child's lunch box or back pack. If a child requires an Epi-Pen, you should send one to the school office. The Epi-Pen will be kept in the sickroom.

DISCIPLINE – RULES

The staff of Camp Discovery deals with discipline, taking into consideration the age of the child and the nature of his or her offense. We strive to foster self-discipline and help build a positive self-image. Corporal punishment is not practiced. The staff clearly instructs students concerning classroom and school rules. The students know what is expected of them. Although the following list does not address every possible infraction, it provides a "rule of thumb" for unacceptable behavior.

GENERAL BEHAVIOR THAT IS PROHIBITED:

- Biting
- Fighting
- Profanity, profane gestures or suggestive behavior
- Showing disrespect to or physical or verbal abuse of a staff member, parent volunteer or fellow student
- Intimidation, including name-calling or harassment
- Cheating, lying or any form of dishonesty
- Damaging school equipment, buildings, grounds or other students' property (damaged or destroyed property is to be replaced by the student(s) responsible)
- Possession of any items of violence
- Running in church or school buildings
- Littering
- Violation of camp rules developed by campers and counselors

PLAYGROUND RULES:

- No swinging on trees
- No littering
- No fighting
- No throwing of sticks or rocks
- Use playground equipment properly
- Display good sportsmanship and adhere to game rules
- No jumping off the top of playground equipment
- No climbing up the slide
- No jumping off swings

Please Note:

Children ages (3-5) need to bring an extra change of clothes & items needed for napping.

TRANSFER & REFUND POLICY:

- If a guardian requests a cancellation, he/she can transfer the child to any available camp at no charge.
- Between February 15 and May 2: Guardian receives a full refund minus a \$25 processing fee per camp session cancelled.
- Between May 3 and June 3: Guardian receives a refund minus a cancellation fee of \$95 per session for Camp.
- After June 3: Refunds will not be permitted but transfers and credit for other camp sessions can be given. Any absence credits due to sickness or emergency must be accompanied by a note from a licensed physician.
- All refund or transfer requests must be submitted in writing and will process within 30 days.

I have read the Camp Discovery Guidelines and understand that adherence to these are required for participation in the program. Failure to follow these guidelines by either the parent or child may result in the discharge from camp.
